#### Juncker wins support for 'last-chance' Commission

President-elect Jean-Claude
Juncker secured confirmation for
his new Commission from MEPs
today (22 October), winning over a
grand coalition of Socialists and
centre-right MEPs, using a
combination of charm and a few
last-minute tweaks to policy.

Parliament's largest three groups, the European People's Party (EPP), the Socialists & Democrats and the Alliance of Liberals and Democrats for Europe (ALDE) broadly voted, with 423 in favour, to support the proposed new 28-strong executive. 209 MEPs voted against, and 67 abstained, primarily, reports indicate, from the conservative ECR group.

"Either we win back the citizens of Europe; drastically reduce the level of unemployment and give young people a European perspective, or we fail."

Aim of the Roadmap


- Give more certainty to governments and investors

## Labelling – convergence?

- **EU A G**: Required energy usage rating
- Energy Star: Voluntary third party label efficiency standard for electrical equipment
- Carbon labelling: Emerging labels "certifying" product level carbon foot printing



## Green Public Procurement

The issues facing GPP are similar to those facing consumers when they look to purchase products and services.

- Limited <u>environmental data</u> on products or services
- Insufficient <u>mechanisms</u>, such as databases, labels and web standards to publicize them.
- Insufficient <u>information</u> on the full life cycle carbon cost of products
- Insufficient <u>information</u> on the relative carbon costs of products / services.




## The internal EU Policy context


- 4/5 Member State Working Group




## Waste Generated – Total kg per capita





## Composting/Digestion kg per capita










## EU votes 'yes' to BIM-friendly procurement shake-up


"The European Parliament voted to support a package of reforms to the EU Public Procurement Directive, which includes clauses designed to encourage all European countries to recommend the use of electronic tools, including BIM, on public works contracts."

"Reforms included in the Directive cover all aspects of **procurement** and must be implemented into national law **within two years** of their publication in the OJEU."




# The 2nd strand of BIM The tool to hold the data (the BIM software model)

## What is a BIM model?

- A digital representation of the building/asset
- Allows data to be tagged or 'attached' to objects/equipment
- Can see clashes easily
- Can produce detailed schedules
- Good for determining quantities and costs

..... Must be coupled with a BIM implementation plan





# The 3<sup>rd</sup> strand of BIM Construction Operations Building information exchange -COBie



## **COBie**

#### **Construction Operations Building information exchange**

- A series of spreadsheets which can house data from the model
- 700 Spreadsheet templates. (Gas Appliances, Electrical Appliances etc)


